Taking part at the weekend:

John Bell. John is a Scottish hymn-writer and Church of Scotland minister. He is a member of the Iona Community, a broadcaster and former student activist. He will be engaging with the Methodist themes of :

'God's bias for diversity' Finding unanimity is a desire which arises when we have to deal with contentious issues. But is it God's intention regarding all things? There is an argument that the Bible, as regards unanimity, doesn't give us a leg to stand on.

'Thinking outside the Box'. At a time when many churches are caught up in rationalizing resources, which normally means doing more with less, there may be a case for alternative thinking. It might even be a divine imperative.

'Singing with the World Church' Methodism, being a global phenomenon, has the great ability to express that in sharing words and music for other cultures, which might also introduce us to a bigger God.

Roger Walton. Roger is a retired ordained presbyter in the British Methodist Church. Amongst various appointments, Roger has been Connexional Secretary for Adult Learning, Director of the Wesley Study Centre, Durham, Chair of the Yorkshire West District and the President of the British Methodist Conference. His research interests are in Christian education and a variety of topics concerning Discipleship and he has published several books on these subjects.

Roger will be leading sessions on The rhythm of the church — Gathering and Scattering with interactive sessions on the parables and exploring the ideas in Mark's gospel. He will also be leading a workshop on The rhythm of spiritual life based on a Methodist Way of Life.

Fischy Music. Fischy Music is a Scottish charity founded in 1998 by Stephen Fischbacher to create songs to nurture positive mental health in children by helping them express and manage a range of emotions. They also write songs which help the whole church to worship together no matter their age or ability. They will be leading a session of Fischy Fun on Sunday morning and participating in the Sunday worship.

Around the Gathering:

Mission Marketplace: Come and chat to All We Can, MHA and the Learning and Development Network. Also browse a range of resources including Methodist Women in Scotland, JPIT, the Fund for Human Need and a Methodist Way of Life (see more information about some of these on p6)

Devotional Room: When not being used for workshops, the devotional room will be available for prayers, either prompted by the prayer stations or led by individuals. For information see the programme.

Pilgrimage: The Gathering is taking place in the middle of an historic City. Pilgrimage is an ancient spiritual practice in which we discover more of the God of journey. There is an opportunity to explore it as part of either a guided or self-led pilgrimage, taking between 60 and 90 minutes. The route is not strenuous. Booklets for the self-guided pilgrimage are available at the Help Desk and should be returned there after use.

Gathering unpacked: For those not involved at Synod, head to Perth Methodist Church and engage in games, quizzes and challenges with input from All We Can and the Learning and Development Network.

Forest Church: Forest Church is an opportunity to participate in nature, led by Rev. Beth McDowell. It will include time to eat, prayers, meditation and reflection together and some gentle interaction with the space around. If you would like to be part of this, please gather with your lunch in the Riverside Park* as soon after 1pm as you can. It will finish in good time for you to engage with the afternoon programme. [*From the Salutation Hotel, turn Right along South Street, this leads directly into Queen's Bridge to cross the Tay. Go to the end of the bridge and turn right where you will see an archway into Rodney Gardens. Go under the arch and look for Beth and a Forest Church sign. Maps will be available at the Help Desk.]

NB Forest Church will go ahead whatever the weather, so do come prepared if you are keen to participate; you may also like to bring something to sit on.

Salutation Hotel

In the early 1600's the Salutation Hotel was a private house, owned by the Murray family, (Also known as Lord Scone and Viscount Stormont). From 1699, when we know the building served as a coaching inn until 1745, the history of the Salutation is vague. It has been thought that it may have been managed by the Franciscan Order, otherwise known as the Greyfriars, It is least likely that it was within their grounds. The Salutation formerly known as Salutation Inn has become the oldest established hotel in Scotland as well as one of Perth's unofficial landmarks. Postcode PH2 8PH

Perth Methodist Church

There has been a Methodist 'society' in the Royal Burgh of Perth since at least the early 1760s. When John Wesley made his first visit to Perth in 1768, the society was already in being. He came back to the city a further five times. Indeed his continuing commitment to Perth was recognised by the City fathers in 1772 when they presented him with the 'Freedom of the City'.

It became a very strong lay led society with deep roots within the wider Perth community. The current Church, in a modest Gothic style was opened in 1880. Over the years it has been extended and developed in many ways, but would doubtless still be recognised by the courageous people whose faith and vision brought it into being. This building however is no more than the home for a continuing and lively Methodist society. The Methodist people in Perth are proud of their past, but live in the present age, looking in faith to the future. A major refurbishment of the premises was completed in 2017 and the congregation is enthusiastic about its continuing work and witness in the city centre. Postcode PH2 8JN
